In today's Gospel Jesus' command to gather the leftover fragments teaches us about the abundance of God's blessings and our responsibility to manage them. By collecting what remains, we are reminded that nothing should go to waste, especially when others are in need. This calls us to practice charity, ensuring what we have are shared with those in need. Just as the disciples filled twelve baskets, our efforts here at St. Joseph-St. Lawrence in gathering and redistributing resources via Catholic Charities transforms scarcity into sufficiency for those who hunger. Let's be attentive stewards, mindful that every fragment expresses God's generosity through tangible acts of love. Remember: we collect canned goods every week. Please be generous.


